Attunement

In all their affliction He was afflicted, And the Angel of His Tresence saved them; In His love and in His pity He redeemed them; And He bore them and carried them All the days of old. Isaiah 63:9

Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. Romans 12:15

According to Dr. Karl Lehman, Attunement is an especially important form of interpersonal emotional connection in which the Receiver feels seen, heard, understood, joined, and cared about. Perfect attunement is when the Receiver feels all these things and that the attuner is glad to with them. It is more than simple acceptance, agreement, empathy, sympathy, active listening or reflective listening. It goes beyond seeing, hearing, understanding and even caring. It is joining or being with the other person in his circle. When the Receiver receives attunement, their Relational Circuits come on and the upset (Anger; Fear; Sadness; Shame; Disgust; Hopeless Despair) turns to righteousness, peace and joy. Misattunement, on the other hand, is when we miss that mark. The Receiver will feel not seen, heard, understood, joined, and cared about. He will not have his relational circuits turned on. He will not feel righteousness, peace and joy. Instead, he will feel any combination of anger, frustration and isolation. He will continue to try to explain and defend or he will give up without satisfaction. Biblical examples of attunement include person to person, God to people, Jesus to individuals, and individuals to God.

Examples of God Attuning in the Old Testament

Hebrew Children:

Exodus 3:7 And the LORD said: "I have surely seen the <u>oppression</u> of My people who *are* in Egypt, and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters, for I know their sorrows. Acts 7:34 I have surely seen the <u>oppression</u> of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their groaning and have come down to deliver them. And now come, I will send you to Egypt.

Israelites:

2 Kings 14:26-27 For the LORD saw *that* the <u>affliction</u> of Israel *was* very bitter; and whether bond or free, there was no helper for Israel. And the LORD did not say that He would blot out the name of Israel from under heaven; but He saved them by the hand of Jeroboam the son of Joash.

Hagar:

Genesis 16:13 Then she called the name of the LORD who spoke to her, You–Are–the–<u>God–Who–Sees</u>; for she said, "Have I also here seen Him who sees me?"

Father God Attunes to the Prodigal Son

This attuning father takes on the shame of his son and is truly with him in spite of what the social mores of the day, the social conscience, the community, the servants and his older son think. This parable is a picture of Father God and us.

Luke 15:20-24 And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. "And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer worthy to be called your son.' "But the father said to his servants, 'Bring out the best robe and put *it* on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on *his* feet. 'And bring the fatted calf here and kill *it*, and let us eat and be merry; 'for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' And they began to be merry."

Attunement in the Book of Job

At first, Joh's friends attune to him. They are in the circle with him. They are silent. They have nothing to say in the face of Joh's overwhelming tragedy. They are just with him. They feel overwhelmed with him. In their silence, they acknowledge that this string of tragedies is impossible to understand or handle. They feel what he feels.

Job 2:11-13 Now when Job's three friends heard of all this adversity that had come upon him, each one came from his own place—Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite. For they had made an appointment together to come and mourn with him, and to comfort him. And when they raised their eyes from afar, and did not recognize him, they lifted their voices and wept; and each one tore his robe and sprinkled dust on his head toward heaven. So they sat down with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that *his* grief was very great.

Misattunement in the Book of Job

Job's friends soon are not able to stay attuned with Job in his emotional state because they do not have enough emotional capacity to remain with him in his circle. They step out of the circle and begin to accuse, explain, judge, correct, instruct, threaten and theologize—generally try to fix Job and his situation. Their discussion is found in Job 3-37. Job is not helped by their "helping" him. He responds with anger, trying to defend himself.

- Job 13:4-5 But you forgers of lies, You *are* all <u>worthless physicians</u>. Oh, that you would be silent, And it would be your wisdom!
- Job 16:1-5 Then Job answered and said: "I have heard many such things; <u>Miserable comforters</u> *are* you all! Shall words of wind have an end? Or what provokes you that you answer? I also could speak as you *do*, <u>If your soul were in my soul's place</u>. I could heap up words against you, And shake my head at you; *But* I would strengthen you with my mouth, And the comfort of my lips would relieve *your grief*."

Job 19:1-4 Then Job answered and said: "How long will you torment my soul, And break me in pieces with words? These ten times you have reproached me; You are not ashamed that you have wronged me. And if indeed I have erred, My error remains with me."

Job's wife is another misattuner. In her pain at losing everything including her children and watching her husband cope with a terrible disease, she encourages him to give up and die. She also does not have the emotional capacity to remain with him in his emotional state.

Job 2:9 Then his wife said to him, "Do you still hold fast to your integrity? Curse God and die!"

Attunement is God's Answer in the Book of Job

Job 38:1-42:6 God does not attune like we might think He would. Instead, God brings Job in tune with Him. He distracts Job. Job can't think of anyone or anything else but God. Gd shows Himself and His greatness. Job responds:

Job 42:5 ""I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear, But now my eye sees You."

In Immanuel sessions, Immanuel will attune to the Receiver and then bring the Receiver into His circle and all of a sudden, the Receiver can only think of how great God is. The Receiver experiences God for who He really is. The Receiver's relational circuits come on. The Receiver reports perfect peace and satisfaction-- righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Jesus Attunes While On the Earth

Woman Caught in Adultery:

John 8:3-11 Then the scribes and Pharisees brought to Him a woman caught in adultery. And when they had set her in the midst, they said to Him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in adultery, in the very act. "Now Moses, in the law, commanded us that such should be stoned. But what do You say?" This they said, testing Him, that they might have *something* of which to accuse Him. But Jesus stooped down and wrote on the ground with *His* finger, as though He did not hear. So when they continued asking Him, He raised Himself up and said to them, "He who is without sin among you, let him throw a stone at her first." And again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. Then those who heard *it*, being convicted by *their* conscience, went out one by one, beginning with the oldest *even* to the last. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst. When Jesus had raised Himself up and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."

Woman Sinner at Simon the Pharisee's Banquet:

Luke 7:36-50 Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat. And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that *Jesus* sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, and stood at His feet behind *Him* weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped *them* with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed *them* with the fragrant oil. Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw *this*, he spoke to himself, saying, "This man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman *this is* who is touching Him, for she is a sinner." And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." So he said, "Teacher, say it." "There was a certain creditor who

had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. "And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?" Simon answered and said, "I suppose the *one* whom he forgave more." And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped *them* with the hair of her head. You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. "You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, *the same* loves little." Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" Then He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."

Jesus Attunes After His Resurrection

Peter's Friendship Love:

John 21:15-17 So when they had eaten breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love [agape] Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love [friendship] You." He said to him, "Feed My lambs." He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love [agape] Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love [friendship] You." He said to him, "Tend My sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love [friendship] Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love[friendship] You." Jesus said to him, "Feed My sheep."

Disciples' Unbelief:

John 20:20 When He had said this, He showed them *His* <u>hands</u> and His <u>side</u>. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.

Thomas's Unbelief:

John 20:25-27 The other disciples therefore said to him, "We have seen the Lord." So he said to them, "Unless I see in His <a href="https://hands.com/hands.

Jesus Attunes After His Ascension

Stephen's Martyrdom:

Acts 7:54-60 When they heard these things they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed at him with *their* teeth. But he, being full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, and said, "Look! I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" Then they cried out with a loud voice, stopped their ears, and ran at

him with one accord; and they cast *him* out of the city and stoned *him*. And the witnesses laid down their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul. And they stoned Stephen as he was calling on *God* and saying, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he knelt down and cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not charge them with this sin." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

Paul on Trial Alone:

2 Tim 4:16-18 At my first defense no one stood with me, but all forsook me. May it not be charged against them. But the Lord stood with me and strengthened me, so that the message might be preached fully through me, and *that* all the Gentiles might hear. And I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion. And the Lord will deliver me from every evil work and preserve *me* for His heavenly kingdom. To Him *be* glory forever and ever. Amen!

Attunement To Jesus While He was on the Earth

Mary of Bethany:

Mark 14:3-9 And being in Bethany at the house of Simon the leper, as He sat at the table, a woman came having an alabaster flask of very costly oil of spikenard. Then she [Mary] broke the flask and poured *it* on His head. But there were some who were indignant among themselves, and said, "Why was this fragrant oil wasted? For it might have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor." And they criticized her sharply. But Jesus said, "Let her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a good work for Me. "For you have the poor with you always, and whenever you wish you may do them good; but Me you do not have always. "She has done what she could. She has come beforehand to anoint My body for burial. "Assuredly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be told as a memorial to her."

John 12:1-8 Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him. Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil. Then one of His disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, who would betray Him, said, "Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it. But Jesus said, "Let her alone; she has kept this for the day of My burial. "For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always."

Misattunement To Jesus While On Earth

Peter, James and John in Gethsemane:

Matthew 26:36-45 Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and said to the disciples, "Sit here while I go and pray over there." And He took with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and He began to be sorrowful and deeply distressed. Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful,

even to death. Stay here and watch with Me." He went a little farther and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." Then He came to the disciples and found them asleep, and said to Peter, "What? Could you not watch with Me one hour? "Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Again, a second time, He went away and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if this cup cannot pass away from Me unless I drink it, Your will be done." And He came and found them asleep again, for their eyes were heavy. So He left them, went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words. Then He came to His disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of sinners."

Mark 14:32-37 Then they came to a place which was named Gethsemane; and He said to His disciples, "Sit here while I pray." And He took Peter, James, and John with Him, and He began to be troubled and deeply distressed. Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. Stay here and watch." He went a little farther, and fell on the ground, and prayed that if it were possible, the hour might pass from Him. And He said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for You. Take this cup away from Me; nevertheless, not what I will, but what You will." Then He came and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "Simon, are you sleeping? Could you not watch one hour?"

Attunement Illustration

A little boy drives his scooter over his toys in the driveway and falls off onto the cement. His elbow is bleeding. He runs to his Mommy for her to comfort him and to be with him. Mommy might be unable or unwilling to attune because she is distracted or scared or annoyed with him.

1. She might offering misattunement,:

Accuse him: "This is your own fault. Why can't you watch where you are going?

Explain to him: "It's because you leave your toys out that this happened to you.

<u>Correct</u> him: "Don't drip that blood all over.

<u>Instruct</u> him: "Next time pick up your toys first and go slower and watch where you are going!"

Threaten him: "The next time you do that, I will take all your toys away."

<u>Theologize</u>: "God's not going to help you when you are so wild all the time."

Give Perspective: "Well, it could have been worse. You could have poked your eye out."

<u>Judge</u> him: "Every day I tell you not to leave your toys in the driveway and every day you do that --

You're not obedient."

<u>Fix him:</u> "Stop crying and feel better. It's only a little scrape."

2. Or She might offer attunement:

See him: Mommy silently looks at him with sad eyes. "Poor Baby. That looks awful."

Hear him: "It hurts and it's scary too."

<u>Understand</u> him: "Can I hold you until it stops hurting?"

Be with him: "I hate it when I fall down and scrap my elbow. That one of the worst places."

Care for him: Mommy hugs him and wipes the blood off. Takes him inside the house to put on a Band-Aid.

In attuning with her son, Mom is with her son where he is and attends to him before straightening out the situation. The results are that he will return to joy, his relational circuits will be back on, he will feel peace and satisfaction.

Affliction
