Private Revelations of God

Now it came to pass in the thirtieth year, in the fourth month, on the fifth day of the month, as I was among the captives by the River Chebar, that the heavens were opened and I saw visions of God. Ezekiel 1:1

God appears to many people in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. These are what I am calling "private revelations." Jesus promises to manifest Himself to His people. Paul prays that through the Holy Spirit, the members of body of Christ will encounter Jesus today. Some of us have seen and experienced God in corporate settings similar to what happened to the one hundred and twenty in the upper room. Everyone present experienced God in the same way. However, Immanuel can be encountered personally in a crowd where others do not experience Him or experience Him in a different way. During an Immanuel prayer time, people experience Him through their five spiritual senses. These revelations or manifestations of God belong to the two of them; I rarely see Jesus in the same way in these sessions together although I look for Him with me. Because He is with all of us at the same time, the private revelation of God is a common experience.

Jesus Sees God While With People Who Do Not See

<u>Ezekiel</u>

Now it came to pass in the thirtieth year, in the fourth month, on the fifth day of the month, as <u>I was among</u> the captives by the River Chebar, that the heavens were opened and <u>I saw visions of God</u>. On the fifth day of the month, which was in the fifth year of King Jehoiachin's captivity, <u>the word of the LORD came expressly</u> to <u>Ezekiel</u> the priest, the son of Buzi, in the land of the Chaldeans by the River Chebar; and the hand of the LORD was upon him there. Ezekiel 1:1-3

<u>Stephen</u>

When they heard these things they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed at him with their teeth. But he, being full of the Holy Spirit, <u>gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus</u> standing at the right hand of God, and said, "Look! I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" Then the Lord said to him, "Arise and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." And <u>the men who journeyed with him stood speechless, hearing a voice but seeing no one.</u> Then Saul arose from the ground, and when his eyes were opened he saw no one. But they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. And he was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank." Acts 9:3-9
